GENERAL INFORMATION

GENERAL STATIONERY REQUIREMENTS

RESPONSIBILITIES

Learning is enhanced when students arrive well prepared for class. Students, parents, teachers and the school have shared responsibility for this as outlined below.

Parents

Parents are responsible for providing the required materials for learning each year and replace/replenish these items as required throughout the year. They should frequently check school bags for cleanliness, required equipment and personal organisation and teach their children to be organised for learning. Parents should seek support from the school where they are experiencing financial difficulties and unable to provide the required equipment to support their child's learning.

Students

Students are required to bring all materials to class each lesson, keep learning materials well organised and advise their parents of items that require replenishment.

Teachers

Teachers are responsible for monitoring that students have the required materials and are bringing these to class every day. They will teach their students to be well organised for their class and should advise parents when required materials are not being brought to class.

School

The school will support families experiencing financial difficulties who are unable to provide the required equipment to support their child's learning.
